# Randolph County Community Information

Randolph County is a beautiful, productive, friendly community where the Delta meets the Ozarks. Also, the only county in the state of Arkansas that can boast of having five rivers! Pocahontas offers more than 2,000 acres of industrial sites and a 140 acre Industrial Park. The community offers a combination of resources, available trained labor and ideal plant sites, all of which combine to make this an ideal place for business and industry to locate. The Randolph County educational system is well-equipped to meet the training needs of industrial prospects. Black River Technical College, a comprehensive two-year college, offers a wide variety of technical and collegiate transfer courses. Williams Baptist College, a four year private liberal arts college is located in Walnut Ridge, approximately a 15 minute drive from Pocahontas. Arkansas State University, a four year state supported school, is 42 miles away in Jonesboro. Randolph County boasts a low building cost of approximately \$100 a square foot for both residential and commercial properties. A competitive tax structure offers a 6.50 percent state sales tax, with the corporate income tax falling between one and six percent. Randolph County has one of the lowest property tax rates in the nation.

The Pocahontas area is well served by the highway system and Pocahontas Municipal Field, which has a 4,000 foot lighted runway that allows instrumental landing and high intensity approach. Single and twin engine charter services are also available. Randolph County is truly a sports lover's paradise, with the best in fishing and canoeing in beautiful unpolluted streams. Davidsonville State Park, about 10 miles from Pocahontas, offers camping, boating, a picnic area, playground and nature trails. Buck Hollow Ranch allows guided elk hunts, deer hunts, turkey hunts and fishing. Randolph County is also proven to be an excellent location for duck hunting. Work and play mixed into one amazing community!

Randolph County is governed by the County Judge and the Quorum Court, which is the legislative body of the county. The Quorum Court is made up of nine Justice of the Peace that are elected by the people of the district where they live. The Quorum Court and County Judge meet once a month in a public forum to discuss county business. Randolph County has seven elected officials aside from the County Judge and Justices of the Peace including: County Clerk, Circuit Clerk, County Sheriff, County Collector, County Treasurer, County Assessor and County Coroner.

Each Randolph County city, City of Pocahontas, City of Reyno, City of O’Kean, City of Maynard and City of Biggers, is governed by a Mayor and City Council, which is the legislative body of the city. The City Council members are elected by the people of the city where they live. The Mayor and City Council meet once a month in a public forum to discuss city business. Each City has two elected officials aside from the Mayor and City Council members including: City Clerk and City Attorney.

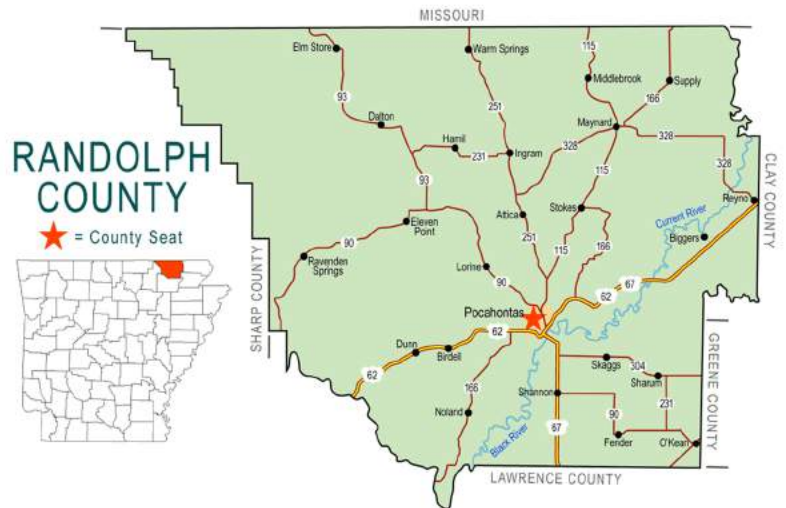

Randolph County boasts having five navigable rivers. making it ideal for outdoor fun and relaxation. Fishing, boating, swimming, canoeing or tubing can be done at each of the five rivers: Black River, Current River, Spring River, Fourche River and Elevenpoint River.

Pocahontas Sports Complex is home to all baseball, softball, t-ball, soccer and flag football games. To learn more about joining any adult or youth league call Pocahontas City Hall at 870-892-3924. The City of Pocahontas also oversees three parks: Thomas O'Marr Park, Riverfront Park and Overlook Park.

Pocahontas Aquatic Center is a state of the art aquatic center that opened its doors in 2015. The Aquatic Center houses an Olympic size indoor pool and indoor therapy pool, both open year round. The Center's outdoor facility includes a splash pad, two water slides and a diving pool that is open during summer months. The Aquatic Center offers water aerobics, swimming lessons and is the home of the Pocahontas Aquatic Dolphians.

The Pocahontas Community Center offers a youth basketball league, men's basketball league, women's basketball leagues, P.A.C.E. exercise class, quilting group and exercise room. Both the gym and four meeting rooms are available for rental by calling Pocahontas City Hall at 870-892-3924.

Randolph County is home to a Davidsonville State Park. Davidsonville offers fishing, paddle boats, hiking trails, two play grounds and many recreational and historical classes and demonstrations.

Do you enjoy bird watching?! Randolph County is a very popular bird watching area due to its location on two of the main migration routes in the U.S. - the Mississippi Flyway and the Central Flyway

If hunting and fishing are your activity of choice then Randolph County is the perfect fit for you! Duck hunting is a hobby shared by many in Randolph County and surrounding areas. ## **Pocahontas Historic District**

Pocahontas, county seat of Randolph County, boasts a rich 17 block Historical District.

Located in the Historic District is the 1872 Old Historic Courthouse, which now houses the Randolph County Chamber of Commerce. Prior to being the home of the Chamber of Commerce, the Old Historic Courthouse was home to Randolph County elected officials until the 1940's then the Randolph County Library until the 1980's.

In addition to the 1872 courthouse, the Historic District includes Arkansas's oldest continuously operating pharmacy, Futrell Pharmacy, operating since 1854 and Arkansas's oldest continuously operating barber shop, the 1893 Sanitary Barber Shop. Buildings in the Historic District date back to 1860, currently these buildings hold businesses such as: Marilyn's Clogging Company, Studio B Salon, Computer Corner, Randolph County Library, Randolph County Heritage Museum, Lesmeister Guesthouse and many others!

The historic presence in Randolph County is far to great to list every asset here.

## **Arts and Entertainment**
